The individual chosen for this distinction will be honored at the Chamber's 74th Annual Meeting and Dinner on November 12th. All Chamber members as well as the public are encouraged to submit nominations. **Special nomination forms and instructions will be available at the Chamber Office or in ads published in the** *Creston News Advertiser*. Nominations for the Citizen of the Year award must be received by **Wednesday**, **October 4**, **2013**.

Another award that will be given by the Chamber of Commerce at the Annual Meeting is the **Volunteer Leadership Award**. This award is to honor an individual for his or her volunteer efforts. Volunteer leadership award entries are judged on the significance of the person's contribution to the betterment of some aspects of community life and his or her record of volunteer service devoted to the growth and improvement of the community.

To nominate someone for the Volunteer Leadership Award, submit a letter explaining why you feel your nominee deserves this recognition by October 4, 2013, to the Creston Chamber of Commerce. Include details concerning the nominee's involvement in community affairs, and please include the nominee's name, occupation, address and phone number. The honoree will receive a check for \$100 to their favorite local charity from the Creston News Advertiser.

The Chamber will also be honoring a young person in Creston with our **Youth Award**. This award is based on a graduating senior's individual achievement, accomplishments and demonstrated leadership in their home, school and community. To nominate such an individual, please send a letter of recommendation to the Chamber telling why you believe the nominee should be considered for this award. The Creston Chamber of Commerce must receive all nominations by October 4, 2013. The winner will also be honored at the Chamber Annual Meeting. They will also be presented a check for a \$100, which will go to the college or institution they will be attending, from the *Creston News Advertiser*.
